



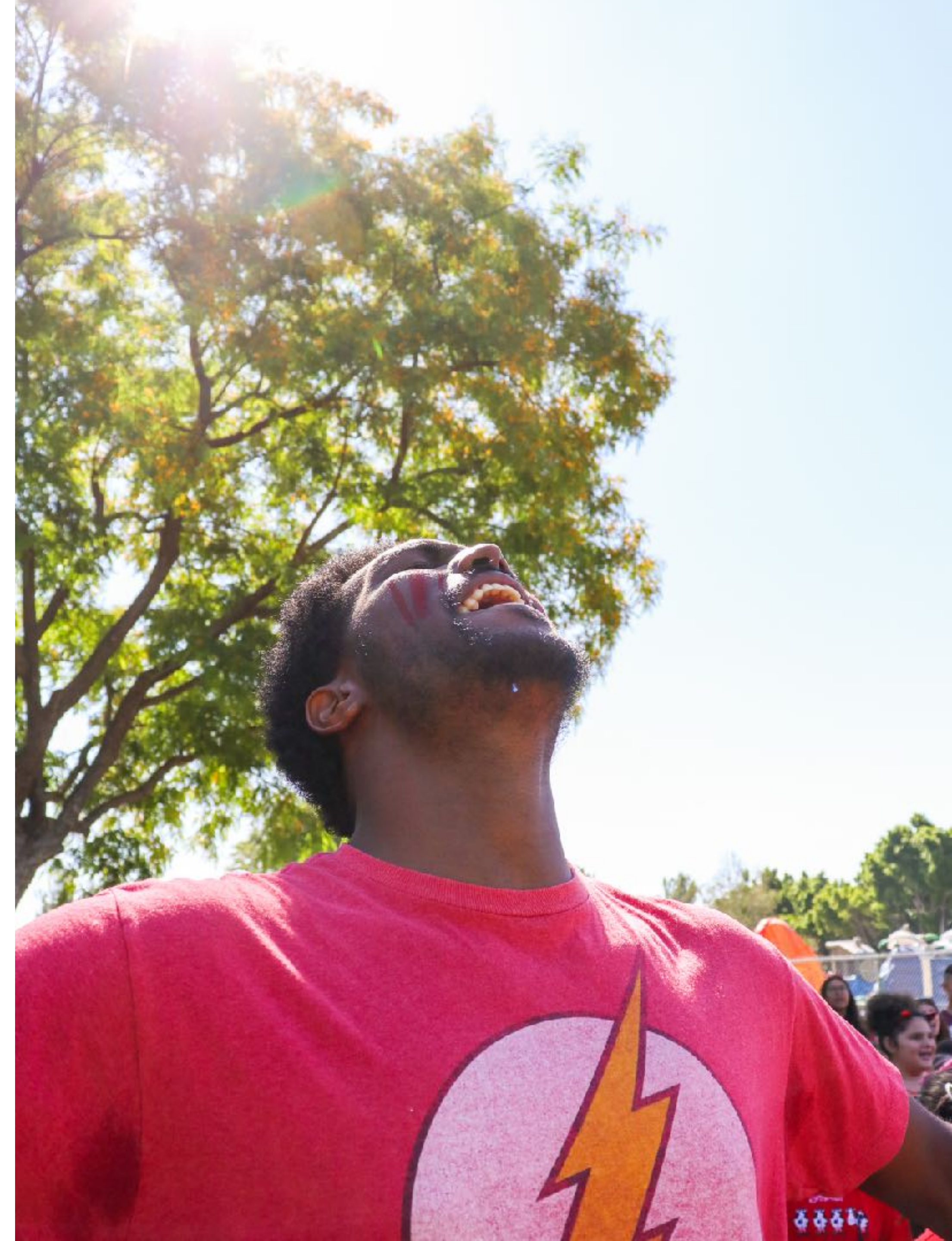

Welcome to Sierra Canyon Day Camp, summer 2020! We are extremely excited to kick off our 49th summer of fun! The following presentation will provide you with a clear overview of how we will operate camp under the new guidelines as written by the State of California.

FACE COVERINGS & SCREENING PROCEDURES

- Campers are required to bring a face covering to camp.
- All staff members will wear face coverings.
- Temperatures will be taken with a no-contact thermometer when staff and campers arrive at carpool or before they board the bus.
- Campers or staff members with a fever will not be permitted on campus. A full refund will be applied to the camp day.



IF A MEMBER OF THE SIERRA CANYON COMMUNITY BECOMES SICK

- Anyone in the Sierra Canyon community (parents, children or staff) who are sick or have recently had close contact with a person with COVID-19 **MUST** stay home until they have met [CDC criteria](#) to discontinue home isolation, including 3 days with no fever, symptoms have improved, and 10 days since symptoms first appeared. Please be respectful of this important guideline!



GROUPINGS

Day Camp Program:

- A maximum of 12 campers per group.
- Our goal is to honor all friend requests, but there is no guarantee this summer.
- 2-3 staff members per group.

Sports Camp:

- A maximum of 15 campers per group (mostly an outdoor program).
- 2 staff members per group.

POOL

- Only two groups per block will be assigned to the pool.
- Each group will be assigned to a designated changing room.
- The use of physical guides for our campers, such as tape on the floor/benches, will help with the practice of social distancing as written in the State guidelines.



ACTIVITIES & PROGRAMS

ALL CAMP ACTIVITIES WILL REMAIN OPEN WITH MODIFICATIONS

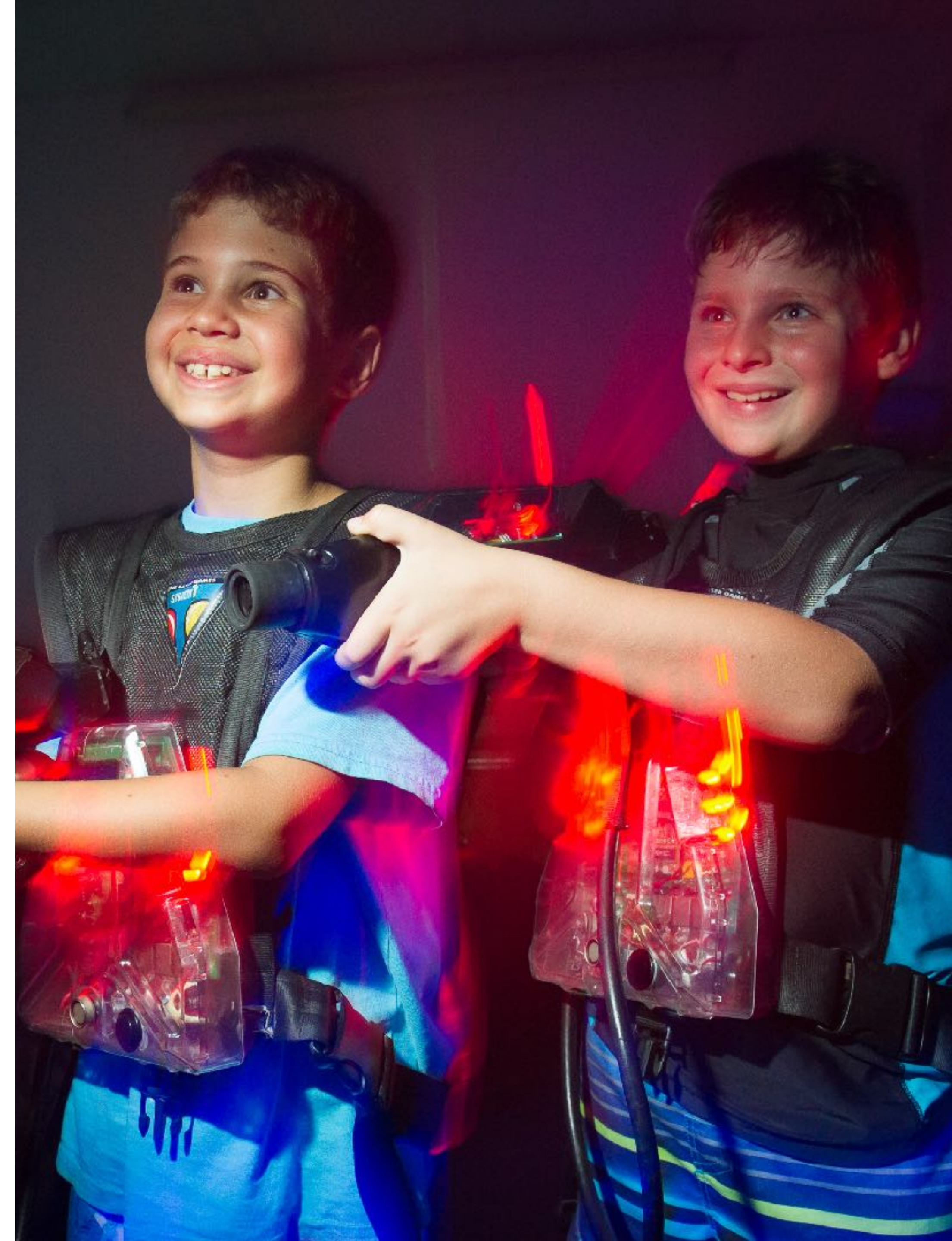
- Activities will host one group at a time
- Wednesdays will include a special activity or entertainment in lieu of free-choice
- Activities will be disinfected after each visit



ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

- In order to limit the number of people at camp, we are NOT allowing parents to stay on campus.
- We ask that parents/guardians not exit their vehicles when picking up or dropping off their children. *
- Upon arrival, campers will receive a no-touch temperature reading. Once cleared, they will be escorted to their group area.

**We recognize that there may be some separation issues with our younger campers. In this instance, we have a system in place that allows parents to escort their children to a designated area on campus where their child's camp counselor will meet them to help with this transition.*



CLEANING, DISINFECTING & HYGIENE

- **We will teach and reinforce healthy hygiene practices including properly washing hands throughout the day.**
- **Staff will clean and disinfect rooms, table surfaces, door handles, etc. after each activity or location used by the group.**
- **We will be hyper-vigilant about following all cleaning and disinfecting guidelines as outlined by the State of California. Our maintenance and cleaning crew will be using cleaning products approved by the EPA for the use against COVID-19.**



LUNCH PROGRAM

HOT LUNCH PROGRAMS ARE OPEN

- Utilizing the 8 block schedule, we will incorporate 3 lunch rotations.
 - (PreK - 1st) 11:10am - 11:50am
 - (2nd - 4th) 11:50am - 12:30pm
 - (5th +) 12:30pm - 1:10pm
- Parents may purchase hot lunch tickets via email - camp@sierracanyonschool.org, or online - www.sierracanyondaycamp.com
- Lunch tickets will NOT be available for purchase in person.
- Parents may send cash or a check to purchase lunch tickets with their child(ren) via their counselor.
- Counselors will pick up pre-packaged hot lunches and deliver them to their group.
- Groups will be assigned different locations on campus to eat lunch in order for us to maintain social distancing practices.



TRANSPORTATION

- Busses will adhere to social distancing practices as well as CDC guidelines for transportation services. They will continue to operate as scheduled.
- Campers will be prescreened using a no-contact thermometer by the bus counselor before entering the bus.
- Parents who are picking up or dropping off their children must wear face-coverings when approaching the bus.



CLOSING CIRCLE

GOING VIRTUAL!

- Closing Circle will be a “pre-recorded” livestream show hosted by camp staff several times a week.
- We will acknowledge camper birthdays, sing camp songs, host counselor challenges & more to keep the camp spirit alive!
- Closing Circles can be watched from home after the camp day. (The link to closing circles can be found on our website.)



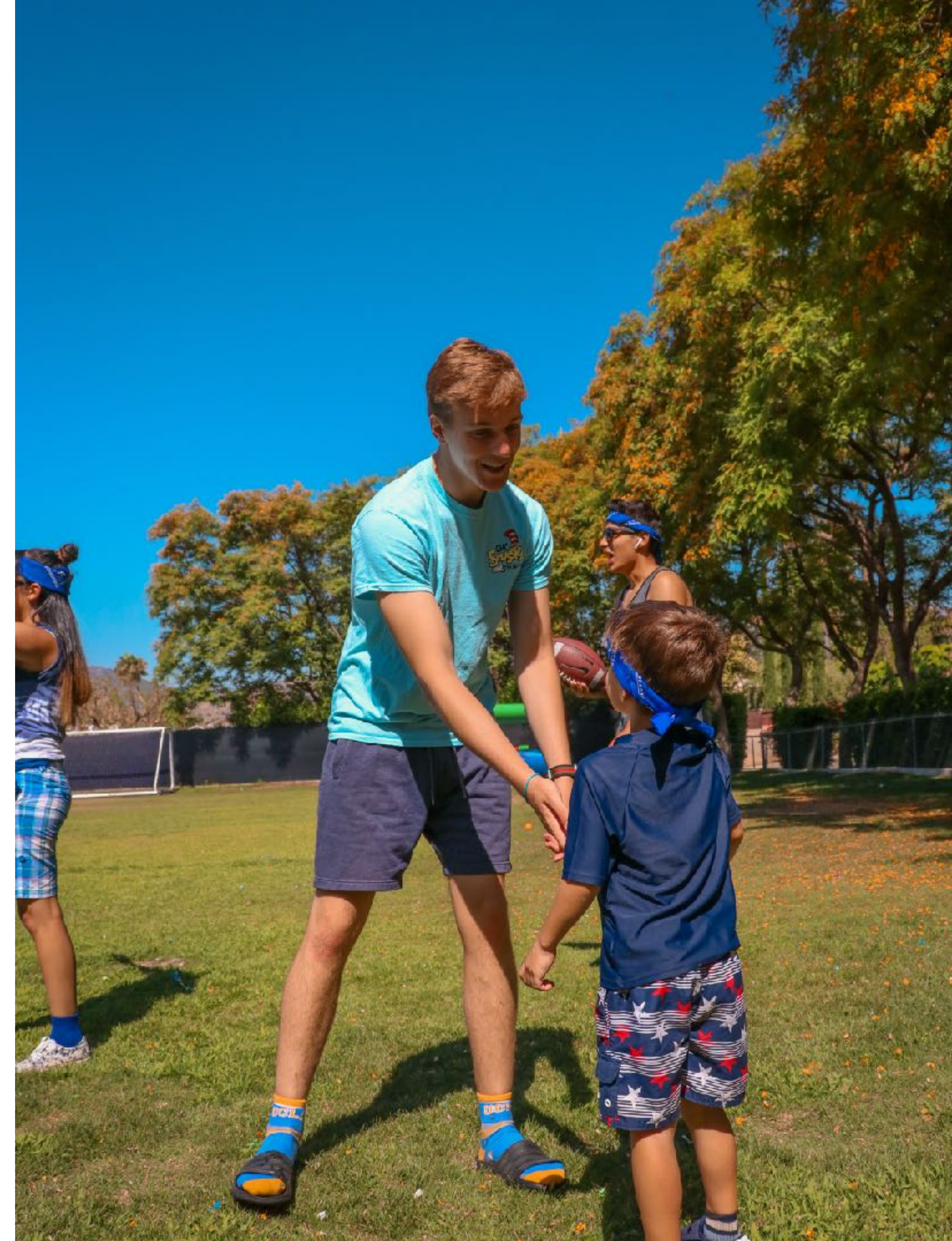
OTHER CAMPUS POLICIES

- Due to the statewide guidelines, parents, visitors, and other non-essential camp staff will not be permitted on campus (unless authorized by a camp administrator).
- Late Arrivals:
 - Campers arriving late to camp may be dropped off at carpool until 9:50 am. Those arriving later than 9:50 am will need to remain in their vehicles, call the camp office. A staff member will greet, prescreen, and escort your child(ren) to their group.
- Early Leaves:
 - In the event you need to pick up your child(ren) early, please call our camp office and let us know what time you will be arriving. Your child(ren) will be escorted to your vehicle. Parents will not be permitted to enter the camp office.



FIRST DAY OF CAMP PROCEDURES

- Upon arrival, your children will be escorted by a staff member to one of our “welcome” tables. We will provide campers with their group sticker and then escort them to their group area.
- Each counselor will lead their group in an opening circle of activities, ice breakers, and explain the camp rules.



EXTENDED DAY CARE

- EDC hours are from 7 am – 6 pm daily.
- Campers will be assigned to different rooms /play locations based on their age with a limit of 12 campers per room.
- Parents will be greeted by a staff member at carpool who will radio for your child(ren) to be escorted to the car.
